A Thermal Imaging camera has been used to detect draughts and areas where insulation can be improved. The use of low-energy light bulbs has been encouraged and a light bulb library obtained to help in the selection of new bulbs. Information has been provided on solar energy and the use of heat pumps, both of which have been eagerly adopted by villagers. Barton School Eco group' has achieved the silver award of the Eco Schools programme.	ONGOING
